COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course stresses expansion of effective listening comprehension through culturally and linguistically appropriate activities.

COURSE GOALS:

- 1. recognize the emphasis of word and sentences;
- 2. accurately catch the sound, rhymes and tones of Chinese language;
- 3. understand simple conversational expressions in daily life occasions, their teacher's in-class instruction in slow speed, and common social communications;
- 4. understand the basic main ideas of the speakers in communication.
